## Description:

This document provides a comprehensive report setting out findings resulting from engagement with member registries in relation to the WMDA Accreditation Programme, the improvements, efforts, support and accreditation activities performed by WMDA as well as a synthesis of the achievements made in 2020.

WMDA is in continuous contact with its members and other stakeholders through different channels. WMDA gathers information in meetings, webinars, through the WMDA membership website (WMDA Share), surveys and of course WMDA office is accessible and open to questions, suggestions and comments.

Considering all the information, WMDA has stablished the following actions to improve WMDA Accreditation Programme:





### I. New WMDA 2020 Standards – Certification Level

**Justification**: the WMDA Accreditation Programme based on 2017 WMDA Standards had a minimum level of activity to make a registry eligible to apply for Qualification and Accreditation:

#### WMDA 2017 Standards

To be eligible to apply for WMDA qualification/accreditation, a registry must provide evidence that they are providing haematopoietic stem cells from volunteer unrelated donors or banked umbilical cord blood units to patients in another country. A minimum of six (6) donations within the last three years with 2 of the 6 for international patients is required to be eligible for WMDA qualification/accreditation for volunteer donors as a stem cell source. A minimum of 6 cord blood unit shipments within the last three years with 2 of the 6 for international patients is required to be eligible for WMDA qualification/accreditation for cord blood as a stem cell source. The remaining 4 donations/stem cell shipments may be for national patients. A registry applying for both unrelated donors and cord blood units must meet the criteria for both stem cell sources.

This minimum level of activity was a barrier for small registries and emerging registries or registries starting to operate internationally.

In awareness of the importance of including these registries in the global collaboration network, and to be coherent with WMDA Mission, Vision and Aims:



**VISION** - Patients worldwide have equal access to high quality cells for transplantation from donors whose rights and safety are protected.

**MISSION** - To promote global collaboration and the sharing of best practices between its members for the benefit of stem cell donors and patients.

**AIMS** - Optimising 'Search, Match & Connect', supporting global development, promoting donor care and ensuring quality.



WMDA has implemented a new category open for those registries that do not achieve the minimum level of activity.

This change has come into force in July 2020, when the 2020 WMDA Standards became effective.

#### WMDA 2020 Standards

To be eligible to apply for WMDA certification/qualification/accreditation, a registry must provide evidence that they are providing hematopoietic stem cells from volunteer unrelated donors or banked umbilical cord blood units to patients in another country.


A minimum of six (6) donations within the last three years with 2 of the 6 for international patients is required to be eligible for WMDA qualification/accreditation for volunteer donors as a stem cell source. The remaining 4 donations may be for national patients.

A minimum of 6 cord blood unit shipments within the last three years with 2 of the 6 for international patients is required to be eligible for WMDA qualification / accreditation for cord blood as a stem cell source. The remaining 4 stem cell shipments may be for national patients.

If the minimum activity is not reached by the registry, the registry can apply for WMDA certification (instead of WMDA qualification).


To include this new category in the Accreditation programme, we have needed to adapt our processes:

- Review and update of WMDA Share (Confluence tool), including the Certification process.






 Create a WMDA Share template to allow the registries to submit the information regarding the Certification process



- Include in WMDA CRM (data base) the Certification workflow and all related requirements.








Figure 1 WMDA 2020 Intl. Standards including Certification Level

The new category in the accreditation programme allows small organisation with limited number of donations provided to comply with internationally accepted standards and provide evidence that they comply with the EU Directive.



# II. Improvements in WMDA Confluence tool (WMDA Share)

One of our most important tools to improve the Accreditation Programme is the feedback from stakeholders. According to the surveys we performed on 2019, WMDA has identified the following improvement actions related with WMDA Share tool.




### **Improvements in WMDA Accreditation Confluence Tool**


- Provide clear instructions and information about the process

First Share page which registries see is a welcome page that contains all the information to prepare the application (this page did not exist in previous version).

- Make the tool more user friendly: better layout, structure and easier navigation
- State the timeline for the whole process: overview of the new process with all due dates for each step.
- Minimize workload for registries: Provide all the information WMDA already has about the Registry







These improvements will mainly benefit small registries that do not have an IT department, and/or are not familiar with IT tools, and/or do not have so many resources and cannot accommodate administrative burden.



## III. Weekly Pillar 4 Webinars

WMDA has made a big effort in 2020, during the COVID-19 Pandemic, to look for spaces for dialogue, exchange of ideas, experiences and knowledge and enrichment of our community, related to the WMDA Accreditation Programme. With this aim, WMDA prepared a set of webinars that covered the most interesting topics of WMDA Accreditation.

Target audience: open to the whole community, especially for certified/qualified/accredited registries or willing to apply.

Lecture weekly on Thursday at 12:00 CET, Duration: 15 minutes

All Webinars were taped and made available at WMDA Share collaboration tool, WMDA Educational Platform and WMDA YouTube channel.




Figure 2 WMDA Educational Platform showing Weekly Quality Webinars.




Figure 3 WMDA Educational Platform showing access to recording, slides and test for each Webinar.

Impact of the Webinars Programme:

#### Lecturers:

WMDA has had the honour of having lecturers who are best known authorities in the field of bone marrow transplantation from twelve different countries around the world. This is a great example of how WMDA is committed to its principles of promoting global collaboration and the sharing of best practices between its members for the benefit of stem cell donors and patients.

This global collaboration is particularly important for emerging registries, small registries or registries with less resources.

100% of respondents would like that the Webinars will continue in 2021.

100% of respondents agreed that the topics were interesting and useful.

#### Plans for 2021:

Given the success of Quality Webinars, WMDA wants to maintain this Programme reconsidering the following aspects:

- Frequency: 64.3% of respondents to the survey prefers to have the Webinars with less frequency (in 2020, the Webinars took place once a week).
- Enhance interaction: Add more sessions for consultation and open discussions about a specific topic.



## IV. Support to registries preparing for Accreditation:

## a. WMDA support to apply for Accreditation

**Justification:** The results from 2019 surveys to registries who have had an accreditation process during that year shown that an improvement was needed to:

- Promote and encourage a climate of closeness and confidence for those registries in the process of Certification/Qualification/Accreditation, and especially for those who are working on the preparation of first time Certification and Qualification.
- Improve the response time.

During 2020, WMDA has made an effort to provide support to registries in all stages of the Accreditation process.

WMDA has in place the following support channels:

As part of our commitment with closeness and confidence, and thanks to the WMDA multicultural team, some parts of the communications/meeting have taken place in the native language of the registry.

Unfortunately, at the time of writing this document, we do not have yet the results from the WMDA 2020 survey but given the congratulatory messages WMDA has received from registries, we expect a significant improvement in our Key Performance Indicators for this service.



## b. "Ask WMDA" session during WMDA Virtual meeting 2020

**Justification:** WMDA has been forced, as many organizations, to cancel face to face meetings during the COVID-19 pandemic. Our aims, from the beginning of this unprecedent circumstances, have been to keep the contact with WMDA community. For that reason, we switched our annual meeting that was going to take place in Quebec, Canada, to a Virtual meeting. WMDA also wants to maintain interaction between different organizations during this virtual meeting. Therefore, we held a session to answer questions form registries. Questions from one registry might be helpful for other registries.






Figure 5 Recording of "Ask WMDA Accreditation" session




## c. Asia-Pacific conference

#### Justification:

WMDA has 69 organisation members (ranging from donor registries, cord blood banks to donor registries with cord blood units) in Asia-Pacific. Only 8 of these organizations are WMDA Qualified or Accredited.

To promote WMDA Accreditation Programme, our Association has participated in the 25<sup>th</sup> Congress of Asia Pacific Blood and Marrow Transplantation Group



The Asia-Pacific Blood and Marrow Transplantation Group (APBMT) was initiated by transplant physicians from Australia, China, Hong Kong, India, Japan, Republic of Korea, Malaysia and Taiwan in 1990 to share the information regarding hematopoietic stem cell transplantation (HSCT) and promote collaborative basic and clinical studies.

As a first result of this conference, Jeevan Stem Cell Foundation, a Cord Blood Bank from India has shown its interest to apply for WMDA Certification/Qualification in 2021. They contacted the WMDA on more information. Jeevan is one of the six registries in India. They are already accredited by the European Federation of Immunogenetics (EFI) and looking forward to meeting the next step in 2021.



### d. Project groups

WMDA has different project groups that provide guidance to registries in the implementation of WMDA Standards through the adoption of best practices.

### i. Crosscheck with Net-Cord FACT Standards

WMDA 2020 Standards contain requirements for Donor Registries and Cord Blood Banks.


FACT – Foundation for the Accreditation of Cellular Therapy at the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Founded in 1996, FACT establishes standards for high quality medical and laboratory practice in cellular therapies. FACT is a non-profit corporation co-founded by the International Society for Cell and Gene Therapy (ISCT) and the American Society for Transplantation and Cellular Therapy (ASTCT) for the purposes of voluntary inspection and accreditation in the field of cellular therapy.

Over 90% of all eligible US facilities and programs are FACT accredited.

NetCord- FACT accreditation programme is internationally accepted.

**Justification:** Requirements for Cord Blood Banks in WMDA 2020 Standards overlap with some of the requirements in the NetCord-FACT Standards.

The aim of this project group is to perform a cross walk between WMDA and NetCord-FACT Standards. When an organization that has a Cord Blood Bank Accredited by NetCord-FACT applies to WMDA



Accreditation, they will need to submit an abbreviated application. The abbreviated application will include the WMDA Standards that are not covered by NetCord-FACT standards. To complete the application, the organization will need to provide a copy of the accreditation by NetCord-FACT.



There are **41** WMDA Standards not covered by NetCord-FACT Standards:

According to this crosscheck, WMDA is preparing a specification for those organizations that wish to apply for WMDA Accreditation and are already NetCord-FACT Accredited. Once the specification is approved by WMDA Board, WMDA will incorporate it to its Accreditation Programme.






Figure 6 Final draft of WMDA Specification for organizations NetCord-FACT accredited applying for WMDA Certification/Qualification/Accreditation.

## ii. Report registry to registry

**Justification:** There are some WMDA Standards (standards 8.09, 8.10, 8.10.1, 9.03, 9.04 and 9.05) that require a standardized procedure/policy for problem management and its reporting. This procedure/policy should describe how problems are reported from one registry to other registries.






Figure 7 WMDA confluence tool (WMDA Share) for the Project group "Problem management".

In July 2020, the Problem management group published the final draft of the form. The document was open for comments and as a result some modifications were done.




Figure 8 F-WG-PM-001 Notification and request for information regarding problen between registries VO 2020092

### V. ISO 17065 Accreditation



#### www.iso.org

- ISO, the **International Organization for Standardization**, has developed different international standards required by business, governments and society to **build trust** in products and services.
- ISO standards are widely respected and accepted by public and private sectors internationally.
- ISO Committee on Conformity Assessment (CASCO) covers topics such as the operating of certification bodies, testing laboratories, marks of conformity, accreditation and mutual recognition of conformity assessment results.

WMDA is a **Certification Body** that certifies registries which comply with WMDA Standards.

ISO/IEC 17065:2012- specifies requirements, the observance of which is intended to ensure that certification bodies operate certification schemes in a **competent**, **consistent and impartial manner**, thereby facilitating the recognition of such bodies and the acceptance of certified services on a national and international basis and so furthering international trade.

WMDA is studying the feasibility of ISO 17065 Accreditation for the WMDA Accreditation Programme.

### **Achievements**

Qualitative and quantitative achievements.

### Quantitative achievements in number of organizations Certified/Qualified or Accredited.

WMDA has listed 134 sources of donors and cord blood units from 98 different organizations (IONs) in 54 different countries.

At the time of writing this report, 84% of the donors and cord blood units are from WMDA Qualified or Accredited organizations.

#### Qualitative achievements to be quantified after WMDA 2020 surveys

To measure all the improvements, we have done during 2020, WMDA has deployed several surveys. These surveys give WMDA a quantitative measurement for the qualitative aspects of the work done. These surveys will also provide WMDA with new inputs for its commitment to continuous improvement.

WMDA expects this information to be available for analysis during the first quarter of 2021. At that moment, we will need to consider the big disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, and the impact it might have had on the WMDA data and results.

The pandemic caused that healthcare professionals were less available and not able to work on quality management in their organisation (by preparing an application for WMDA qualification) or performing a review for an applicant organisation.
